Common services covered in Alberta:

Common services not covered in Alberta:

- Health services provided other than by physician. E.g.: psychologists, massage therapists, chiropractor, etc.
- Vision care for residents 19-64 years of age
- Prescription drugs provided in non-hospital
- Ambulance services (except inter-facility transfers)
- Driver's medical exam
- Doctor note

AHCIP Eligibility

- Remain in Alberta for at least 183 days in a year.
- Not claiming benefits in another province or country
- Have valid immigration document from IRCC

How to Apply?

- 1. Confirm eligibility
- 2. Complete application form Available at the nearest registry
- 3. Gather supporting documents:
- Proof of Alberta Residency
 E.g.: AB driver license, rental agreement, utility or phone bills, etc.
- Identity document
 E.g.: Passport, PR card, or government-issued
 ID card
- Legal entitlement in Canada
 E.g.: PR card, Canadian entry document such as work or study permit

• Used anytime 24/7

 These are used for situations that require immediate medical attention due to severe illness, injury or trauma

Access: Dial 9-1-1

Primary



Deliver first contact healthcare services:

- Prevention of common diseases and injuries
- Referrals to specialists
- Health education, promotion and prevention
- Routine checkups,
- Vaccinations, and screenings
- Management of chronic conditions

Access: Appointment or Walk-in at a Clinic

Secondary



- Specialist doctors are trained in a special area of practice.
- E.g.: Neurologist, Cardiologist, Psychiatrist, etc.
- Specialist appointment take longer to arrange
 Make sure to communicate with your
 primary care team.

Access: Referred by primary family doctor
